

**CHAPTER 1201
TOWN OF SCARBOROUGH
ORDINANCE REASSIGNING POWERS AND DUTIES OF
THE INSTITUTION OF TRUSTEES AT DUNSTAN CEMETERY
MAY 1, 2002**

Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Scarborough, Maine, in town Council assembled, as follows:

The vote of the town meeting on March 6, 1893 on Article 49 instituting the Trustees of Dunstan Cemetery is hereby repealed and the office of the Trustees of Dunstan Cemetery is hereby abolished and the powers and duties assigned to the Trustees of Dunstan Cemetery by such vote are hereby assigned to the Superintendent of the Scarborough Memorial Cemetery. CHAPTER 1201
TOWN OF SCARBOROUGH
INSTITUTION OF TRUSTEES AT DUNSTAN CEMETERY

Reference: Reference Book #6 - Annual Town Meeting, March 6, 1893 page 556 & 557, Article 49.

The Town voted that the selectmen shall in the month of April A.D. 1893 appoint three suitable persons as Trustees of the town cemetery at Dunstan for the terms of one, two and three years respectively, and shall hereafter in the month of April annually appoint a suitable person to fill the vacancy caused by the expiration of a trustees term of office; to hold office for three year, and until his successor is appointed, and may fill vacancies caused by death, resignation or otherwise. The trustees may organize by choice of chairman, secretary and treasurer, and shall keep proper records. The said Trustees shall serve in such capacity without pay and shall have general charge and supervision of the said cemetery, and it shall be their duty to see that it is kept in proper order and condition, and their requisitions for such amounts as may from time to time be necessary for care and improvements shall, if audited and approved by the selectmen, be paid out of any funds that have been or may be received by the town from the sale of lots in said cemetery. The town treasurer shall keep a detailed account of all monies received by him from said cemetery in any way, and of all expenditures made and shall make an annual statement of the same.
